Campus Recovery Leadership Academy

In collaboration with the Association of Recovery in Higher Education (ARHE), SAFE Project will be hosting Collegiate Recovery Leadership Academy during 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 academic years. Students who are accepted into The Academy will complete a year-long recovery-related project on their campus or community with the guidance of a mentor who has expertise in substance use disorder recovery. Accepted students will also attend a weekend Leadership Summit in their region with all expenses paid for by SAFE and ARHE. The Academy is open to college students who are currently in a Collegiate Recovery Program (CRP) or who are interested in developing recovery support services on their campus. The Academy will provide students with the information needed to create and strengthen efforts on their campuses and train them to be effective servant leaders.

Nearly 1 in 4 U.S. college students meet the criteria for substance abuse or dependence, which is 2½ times the proportion of the general population.
