He is known for speaking on increasing or creating pathways to higher education for currently and formerly incarcerated individuals, reentry needs for people leaving prison, and public policies that affect the population. He is a co-founder and the founding Executive Director of the Formerly Incarcerated College Graduates Network (FICGN), a national nonprofit that works to help justice-involved people reach career and higher education success in prison and reentry. Terrell holds a Bachelor of the Arts in Communication and a Masters in Public Administration, both from Rutgers University.



ROSI GREENBERG

Rosi Greenberg is an artist, author/illustrator and leadership development trainer who creates spaces for people to speak unspoken truths and love their mess. Through her leadership development practice, Drawn to Lead, Rosi has trained over 6000 leaders at all levels to share their stories and call communities to action. For the past several years, Rosi has worked with leaders in the Recovery movement to share brave stories of leadership, combat stigma, and change policies to save lives and improve care. Her forthcoming book, Everyone Has a Sam, creates a quirky character of the inner critic and offers ways to move beyond it. In her art, Rosi explores mental health as she intertwines text, line drawing, and swirling color. She brings her artistic talent to teams to help people vision, get on the same page, and document meetings through creative visual scribing. Rosi holds a Master of Public Policy from the Harvard Kennedy School, with a Certificate in Management, Leadership, and Decision Sciences.



DR.BRANDEE IZQUIERDO

Dr. Brandee Izquierdo's drive and determination are built on making an impact within behavioral health, promoting long-term recovery, and ensuring communities are educated and have the tools necessary to combat the addiction epidemic. Before leading the SAFE Project team, Dr. Izquierdo was the Director of Advocacy and Outreach for Faces & Voices of Recovery. In addition, she served as the Associate Director of Special Populations with Behavioral Health System Baltimore and as the Director of Consumer Affairs for the state of Maryland's Behavioral Health Administration. In these leadership roles, Dr. Izquierdo has led advocacy efforts to expand access to behavioral health services and recovery support services while providing technical assistance both nationally and internationally, empowering others within the recovery movement. Her ability to build relationships and bridge gaps within behavioral health, community services, and criminal justice have been a catalyst for global peer expansion.

Susan Packard is the former chief operating officer of HGTV, its cofounder and 2nd employee. Under her helm, HGTV became one the fastest growing media networks in history. As the company grew more brands, like Food Network, she became co-founder of the larger enterprise called Scripps Networks Interactive, which when sold was valued at \$15 billion dollars.

She is the author of three books, New Rules of the Game-Ten Strategies for Women in the Workplace; Fully Human-Three Steps to Grow Your Emotional Fitness for Work, Leadership and Life; and most recently, The Little Book of College Sobriety—Living Happy, Healthy and Free.

She has worked with college students in recovery from substance use addictions these past three years to write her most recent book. She is open about being in long-term recovery from substance use addiction too, describing mental health as just one part of who we are. She travels to universities with invitations to speak, and while there she spends time with students to see what the emerging world looks like through their eyes, and how we can, together, craft new, compassionate ways forward for our workplaces and our whole human family.
