We save lives impacted by substance use through education on stigma, support and development of prevention and recovery programs, and assistance to key communities of interest.



SAFE Campuses works with colleges and universities by providing assistance and training to campus stakeholders, and by supporting students to grow campus recovery communities.



SAFE Communities partners with community leaders to provide tailored solutions to substance use disorder and its impacts. Our programs include: support for youth and adults; Naloxone distribution; and the first-ever National Treatment and Family Support Locator.



SAFE Veterans connects active-duty service members, veterans, their families and caregivers to training and resources to address mental health challenges and substance use disorder.



SAFE Workplaces assists businesses in developing and maintaining programs that foster a healthy and productive business, and support employee wellness to save lives.
